Business legal form

The following five types of businesses may be registered under Cyprus law:

- Limited liability private or public company;
- General or limited partnerships;
- Business/trade name;
- European Company (SE);
- Branch of overseas companies.







Procedures for business constitution or adoption of legal form 1/2

- > Submit an application for the name of the business.
- The application for approval or change of name is submitted by hand or by mail to the "One Stop Shop" Office or to the Registrar of Companies and Official Receiver.
- > Applications for name approval can be submitted online.







Procedures for business constitution or adoption of legal form 2/2

- \succ A name approval is valid for six (6) months.
- If during this period of time (six months from the date of the name approval) a company (business name, partnership etc.) is not registered, the name approval has to be renewed by following the same procedure.







Companies 1/3


The Law 113 provides for two categories of companies:

- A Private Company: requiring one or more founding members, is limited to 50 shareholders, but cannot offer shares for public submission nor does it have the right to transfer shares.
- A Public Company: requiring minimum of seven members and its main feature is the power to extend an invitation to the public to subscribe to its shares



















Partnerships 1/2

Partnerships are registered under the Partnerships and Business Names Law. There are two kinds of partnerships:

General Partnership;

Limited Partnership.







Partnerships 2/2

- The Partnership Registration Form (OE1) is submitted, by hand or by mail, to the One Stop Shop/PSC Cyprus' office or Registrar of Companies and Official Receiver.
- Partnership registration is completed within one (1) month under ordinary procedure or one (1) week (between two (2) to five (5) working days) under accelerated procedure.





RISIT Business/Trade Name

- Business names are registered under the Partnerships and Business Names Law.
- The registration is completed within one month under ordinary procedure or one week under accelerated procedure.





European Company 1/3

The registration of a European Company is in line with the Council Regulation (EC) No. 2157/2001. The main objective is to allow companies incorporated in different member states to merge or form a holding company or joint subsidiary, while avoiding the legal and practical constrains from the existence of different legal systems.








